
2021 SUMMER SOLSTICE SUNDAY, JUNE 20th



What is the Summer Solstice?

The Summer Solstice occurs each year when the path of the sun in the sky is the farthest north in the Northern Hemisphere. At the same time, the sun is also the farthest south in the Southern Hemisphere, which is known as the Winter Solstice. For those of us living in the Northern Hemisphere, the Summer Solstice usually falls on June 20th or 21st. On this day, the sun will travel the longest path through the sky, also making it the longest day of the year. According to astronomical definitions of the seasons, the Summer Solstice also marks the first day of summer.

The state of Florida lies closest to the Tropic of Cancer, which will see more daylight during the Summer Solstice than any other part of the planet. On this day, you can expect to experience about 13.5 hours of daylight.
